The 50th anniversary of the landmark case, Brown vs. Board of Education, has put the civil rights struggle in the United States back into the news headlines. As part of its mission, the Council provides public education and training on Fair Housing laws and other related civil rights laws that protect people from housing discrimination. **On Monday, June 28, 2004, at the Bala Cynwyd Library, in Bala Cynwyd, Pa, from 1pm to 4pm, the Council hosted a Fair Housing Best Practices Seminar for housing providers in the Montgomery County area.** Landlords, Real Estate agents, apartment management staff were in attendance. The goal of the seminar was to reinforce the importance of Fair Housing in our community and to provide tips on how to eliminate discriminatory practices in the housing industry as well as provide recent legal developments under the Fair Housing Act.
